Recently, a grant from Pisgah Rotary has funded efforts to teach not only the families staying at the Haven Family House, but also the Haven Thomas House guests too! A previous guest from 2016, Lisa Palumbo, has volunteered for the position to teach our guests how to prepare healthy meals. The recipes she uses are simple enough that anyone can follow, and she is thrifty enough to make it affordable for everyone. The Cooking with Lisa class has become a hit and the quests look forward to it every week. Some quests have even provided their own recipes to share and teach others what they know about healthy cooking. What a joy for staff to watch the fellowship, community, and see the enthusiasm they possess when they come in on Wednesday knowing they will get to hang out, eat well, and learn something new.

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The Gilpins' Story

Sometimes our jobs can be tough. We have to ma decisions that are hard and we encounter many difficult situations. Here is one example; it's Friday at 4pm. It's been a long week, and I am ready to go home, but a family just walks up and tells me that their "friends" just dropped them off. They have nowhere to go. Nobody they can stay with, and they have stayed on every couch they could. The intake can't be scheduled, it has to be done right now. Mom can't stop crying and with two emotional teenagers in tow, it makes the situation more challenging. Dad is trying to hold it together for all of them, but I could see the relief on their faces when I tell them we have room for them and we can get them in tonight. After being at the shelter for a few weeks, dad lands a great paying job with benefits. They apply for housing and start working a case plan with our Case Manager. After working their job for 90 days, they get a "working preference" with the housing authority, and coupled with a "homeless preference" because they agree to case management after they leave, their name comes up on the list for a four-bedroom apartment....two days before Christmas. What a great holiday this family got to enjoy! Fast forward three months, they are still doing great, stably housed, and enjoying life once again as a family should. Together, housed, warm, loved, and fed. Sometimes our jobs can be rewarding too.

We are so excited to be breaking ground on our expansion project! Site preparation for our build officially began February 16th. This project will take approximately 6 months to complete and will provide us much needed office space for our staff of eight, which is currently sharing two offices. Our current space that is serving as a shared office will provide us a communal place for gatherings including staff development and meetings, guest group sessions, classes for life skills and parenting, and much more!

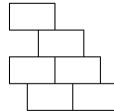
